



General Practice Immunisation Incentive Scheme (GPII)

- Unlike other PIPs, you do not have to be an accredited practice to claim the GPII.
- Practices must be registered for GPII to receive Service Incentive Payment (SIP).

The General Practice Immunisation Incentives (GPII) scheme is designed to encourage GPs to:

- give all the immunisations that are due at each age of the Australian Standard Vaccination Schedule (ASVS).
- report immunisations to the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR).
- achieve immunisation coverage rate above 90% in their practices.

Three immunisation payments are available to General Practices:

1. ACIR Information Payment
2. Service Incentive Payment (SIP)
3. Outcomes Bonus Payment (OP) } GPII Payments

All GPs earn the ACIR information payment of \$6.00 if they report immunisations to the Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (ACIR).

Practices registered for GPII will earn an additional Service Incentive Payment (SIP) and may be eligible for the Outcomes Payment (OP). See a summary of these payments below.

Frequency of Payment	Monthly	Monthly	quarterly

* For example, the 2-month "aged based vaccination schedule includes immunisations against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio, HIB, Hepatitis B (Infanrix Hexa) and Pneumococcal (Prevenar). The child must receive all these immunisations and the GP must report these to ACIR in order for the "schedule" to be complete and the GP eligible to earn the SIP.
