The program is typically three months in length and provides the following services; residential accommodation for women with children, 24hr support and supervision, social work services including case management, drug and alcohol assessment and counselling, individual counselling and group work, living skills training, information and education sessions, recreational outings, court reports and reports for DOCS case conferences and assistance with appropriate post-discharge accommodation. A centre Coordinator, an Administrator, three full time Welfare Support Workers and a part time Welfare Support Worker. Criteria of residence at Guthrie House include facing criminal charges; recently released from prison; on parole, bail or court imposed bonds and a commitment, where applicable, to recovery from alcohol and other drug abuse. As resources are limited, the service is unable to accept women with severe mental illness or developmental disabilities.

Most are victims of abuse and many are mentally ill and/or suffering from substance abuse. Lou's Place was originally opened to be a safe, warm and welcoming haven to rest, eat, shower, wash clothes, enjoy some company and if necessary receive counselling and referrals. However, in response to client needs, Lou's Place has expanded services beyond just meeting immediate physiological and safety needs. Medical, mental health and legal services have been phased in along with programmes to build self-esteem and life/job skills such as creative writing, computer training and art classes. Lou's is unique in that it is staffed by both professional welfare workers and volunteers - a combination that makes Lou's Place like no other in Sydney. Since opening in April 1999, there have been over 28,000 visits by women and children to the centre. Mission Australia is responsible for the daily operation of Lou's Place.

It provides opportunities to men to break the cycle of homelessness. The Centre provides immediate, basic needs such as a safe place to stay, food, clothing and showering facilities. Specialised staff at the Centre are committed to tackling the real problems faced by individuals. They help clients to look for long term solutions to their problems, such as assisting them to find longer term accommodation or to enter into rehabilitative programs. The Rawson Centre was established under the Intoxicated Persons' Act 1979, to offer an alternative to the arrest and subsequent placement of intoxicated people in police cells. Clients can access to the service directly, via Missionbeat, police or referral from other agencies, community services or government departments. The Rawson Centre's Intoxicated Persons' Unit provides 12 overnight beds. Clients at the Centre often have complex needs, including drug and alcohol addictions, family breakdown, mental health issues, and alcohol related brain damage.

Those who successfully complete this phase can progress to stage two (18 to 25 years). This program provides semi-supported living for single young people. Its main aim is to improve living skills and encourage independence. While there is no easy remedy or shortcut in helping our homeless young people, this two-stage program is a very effective model as it provides a continuity of support and long term care.
