Members elect the Board of Directors who are all local GPs. The Board sets the strategic direction of the organisation.

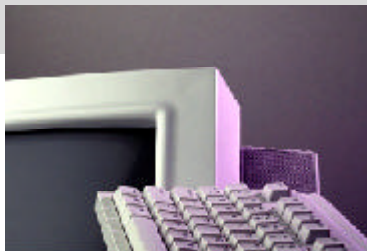
Staff members implement a wide range of activities that support general practice from a whole of practice perspective.

what we do

CSDGP supports general practices in the inner west of Sydney. We help local GPs further enhance the care of their patients; provide innovative services and resources, provide links between GPs, health services and the community; and act as a focus for the professional life of local GPs.

area we cover

The CSDGP covers the geographical inner west from the CBD to Homebush Bay.



support we offer

women and infant health

We offer ongoing training for GPs providing ante/post natal care and foster cross contact between midwives, GPs, consumers and allied health professionals. We offer clinical tutorials and field activities as well as ongoing support.

continuing professional development

We provide regular continuing medical education on various topics relevant to general practice.

mental health partnership

We provide an avenue for improved communication between GPs and local mental health services. This project enhances mental health care of patients by offering a CPD program, case conferencing, information kits and providing the opportunity for GPs to attain SIP payments through the Better Outcomes in Mental Health Care program.

drug and alcohol

We provide activities that collaborate with the CSAHS D&A Unit including a CPD program, referral pathways and shared care opportunities for interested GPs.

risk management

There is a growing emphasis on assessing quality in general practice. We can provide a comprehensive risk management assessment service to local practices.

national prescribing service

The NPS project provides independent information on best practice in prescribing medication. By participating in NPS activities, GPs have an opportunity to attain extra PIP payments.

home medicines reviews

A HMR Facilitator provides GPs and practice staff with information and support about the HMR process through practice visits, phone calls, newsletters and educational sessions.

privacy and confidentiality

Privacy and confidentiality compliance issues are increasingly relevant to Australian general practice. CSDGP has model privacy policies, and can assist practices to put policies and procedures in place to protect staff, patients and doctors.

practice incentives program (PIP)

The PIP aims to compensate for the limitations of fee-for-service arrangements. The incentives seek to focus on aspects of general practice that contribute to quality care. If your practice is accredited, make sure you are receiving the payments due to you.

preventative health

We have an excellent recall remind manual, resources and support for setting up immunisation and chronic disease management systems in general practice

mbs epc items

Many practices have found it difficult to make good use of these new items. We have an excellent collection of templates, easy to use guidelines and provide sensible advice on incorporating these items into day to day practice

accreditation and reaccreditation

Accreditation provides a mechanism for acknowledging the quality of the service offered in a general practice. Accreditation is the only access route to the PIP. We can provide you with assistance for all your accreditation or reaccreditation needs.

nursing in general practice

An increasing number of local practices are employing practice nurses. We can help answer all the frequently asked questions eg. recruitment strategies and more. We even provide CPD activities for nurses working in general practice.

practice computerisation

We promote Information Management in all aspects of general practice (clinical, practice management, communications). We have a computer training laboratory and provide practice visits!
